I'd like to share an example of Pema's selflessness that I witnessed. She cared for an elderly community member at Ser Cho Ling suffering from a severe staph infection. She took on the responsibility of ensuring their well-being, preventing the spread of infection, taking them to doctor's appointments, and monitoring their condition day and night. This dedication reflects the compassion and responsibility Pema brings to everyone she encounters.

Her dedication has reinforced my belief in the power of living with purpose and devotion.
